Responding to their concerns, the city's pollution control board stepped in to find a viable solution. 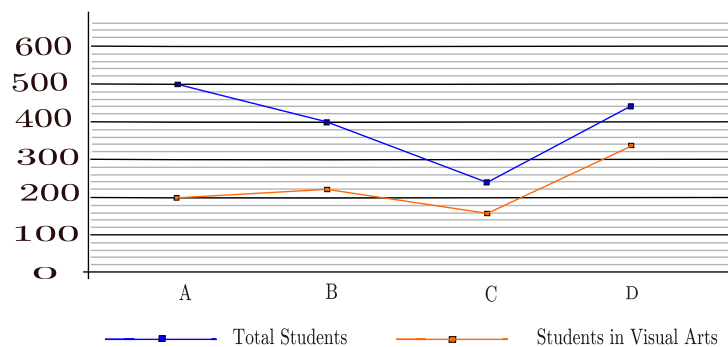
